Radical Hospitality

In Africa, the Masai are known as the fiercest of warriors. Interestingly, though, they greet each other not with, "Hello, how are you?" nor with, "How goes the life of a warrior?" They greet each other with, "How are the children?" The Masai warriors know the well-being of the community's children means prosperity of the whole tribe.

Some 2000 years ago, in a remote region called Galilee, there was a teacher named Jesus. His teaching was difficult and puzzling for most. "Blessed are the poor," he said. And he fed the poor and the hungry, healed the sick, and ministered to women, outcasts, and children in the community. Children in Jesus' day were not like Gerber babies – cute, cuddly symbols of future promise. Among the Jews – oppressed people living in poverty – they were often a liability and the first to suffer from famine, war, disease, and dislocation.



One day, Jesus placed a child before his disciples and said, "…whoever embraces one of these children as I do embraces me, and far more than me – God who sent me."

Jesus' purpose in focusing attention to this child was to call for a re-focusing of values. With that simple act, Jesus actually startled those around him to a radical hospitality toward the most vulnerable. How are we making our world more hospitable for the littlest, the last, the least and the lost?

The wisdom is ancient and cuts across cultural and religious boundaries. Whether from Jesus or from the Masai, we hear that we will know best how we are doing in the important things of life by how we are doing with our children.

The mission of Intermountain embodies that wisdom. Today, far too many children begin their lives without a positive adult relationship. Too many children are still living on the 'edge,' in 'relational poverty,' without the ability to connect or bond, even with people who do care for them. Intermountain exists for them, to embrace them as Jesus did.

For the children in Intermountain's residential program, the treatment is intensive and takes almost two years. It is expensive and exhausting - for the children, their families, and the staff alike. As phenomenal as the residential program is, though, it is not for everyone.

That's why Intermountain now provides a whole array of services for children and families who are struggling with addictions and mental health issues. What began as a rather small home for children suffering from the ravages of poverty in a gold mining town is now a resource to more than 1,500 children and families throughout Montana each year. Intermountain continues to be a place that ensures that children are taken seriously, loved unconditionally, and equipped for a fruitful and faithful life.

On behalf of the children, youth, families, staff and Board of Directors of Intermountain, I would like to thank you for your partnership in our mission. This Impact Report highlights some of your efforts, and we are blessed by every gift and prayer you have sent our way.
